



FAITHWEAVER

David Becomes King

2 Samuel 5:1-5; Psalm 37

David Mourns King Saul

We begin this quarter of Old Testament studies with the anointing of David as king of Israel. Many years earlier, Israel's first king, Saul, had turned from the Lord, and God had selected David to succeed Saul. For years after that, Saul sought to have David killed. However, David had refused to act against Saul or to become king until he was certain of God's timing. He had lived a difficult life, almost as an outlaw. Now Saul was dead; after being wounded in battle, he had taken his own life. In fact, Saul and three of his sons, including David's friend Jonathan, had died in the same battle (1 Samuel 31:1-6). So the door was wide open for David to become king of Israel.

David didn't rejoice when he learned of the deaths. Instead he and all his men mourned and wept the entire day (2 Samuel 1:1-12). David even wrote a song in honor of Saul and Jonathan, which can be found in 2 Samuel 1:19-27. He was truly saddened that their lives had ended as they did.

Uniting the Kingdom

David was made king of Judah. Israel followed Abner, the commander of Saul's army, who made Ish-Bosheth, a son of Saul, king over Israel (2 Samuel 2:1-9). After years of much fighting, intrigue, and bloodshed, Ish-Bosheth was murdered, and the leaders of Israel came to David to make him king over them.

David Leads Israel

David was 37 when he became king over all Israel. He had first been anointed to succeed Saul many years earlier, while still in his teens. After his long, patient wait, David was able to lead Israel to great prosperity, fend off the Philistines, and expand the boundaries BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

of Israel during his reign. David wasn't perfect, but as he relied on God, God rewarded him and Israel with prosperity.

David wrote Psalm 37, which describes his trust in God even when he was surrounded by enemies. In this psalm, David says to "delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart" (Psalm 37:4). This could have been the theme of David's life.

The Jesus Connection

Through Jesus, God showed us how to take every step of life relying on him. Because of Jesus' courage, we can believe that trusting God will always be worth it!

What past experience has God used to teach you how to rely on him?

God has a wonderful way of not letting teachable moments in our lives go to waste. What is God using to teach you right now?

Bible Time

This week's Scripture (2 Samuel 5:1-5; Psalm 37) tells us that God helps us, just as he did for David. God's special people, the Israelites, came to David and asked him to be their king. The Lord had told David, "You will shepherd my people Israel, and you will become their ruler." David was a mighty, powerful, and blessed king because David counted on God to help him.

Key Verse: God is our help (adapted from Psalm 46:1).



Go for a walk in a park with your child. Collect reminders of how God helps you. For example, find a flower as

a reminder that you can count on God to make plants grow. Or find a wet leaf as a reminder that you can count on God for rain. Bring the items home and arrange them on a table to remind your child of God's help.

- · Why does God help us?
- How can you thank God for his help?



Have your child help you make a bedtime

snack each night this week and have a "God helped me" review of the day. For each

snack item, have your child name a way God helped him or her that day. For example, for two scoops of ice cream, say two ways God has helped. Or for five apple slices, say five ways God has helped.

How did God help you today?

This week, your child learned that God helps us. Your child committed to one of the following challenges

to learn that God helps us. Help your child weave faith into life this week and follow through on the challenge!

- Thank God for providing a meal or snack.
- Thank God for your family, and give them each a big hug.
- Draw a picture of your favorite things, and then thank God for giving you those things.



Have an "eyes-open" prayer with your child. Tour your house and thank God for all he's given you.

Take turns saying the following prayer and thanking God for blessings such as furniture, clocks, a piano, pets, flowers, food, stove, refrigerator, and chairs.
