# **David Becomes King**

2 Samuel 5:1-5; Psalm 37

Y oung children think very concretely and probably won't be able to completely grasp the concept of being able to count on someone they can't see or touch. But they do understand when someone helps them. Use this lesson to help children understand that God is dependable and he helps them. Help them understand that they can count on God in the same way they can count on you and the other adults in their lives to help them, to protect them, and to always be there for them.





## David Mourns King Saul

We begin this quarter of Old Testament studies with the anointing of David as king of Israel. Many years earlier, Israel's first king, Saul, had turned from the Lord, and God had selected David to succeed Saul. For years after that, Saul sought to have David killed. However, David had refused to act against Saul or to become king until he was certain of God's timing. He had lived a difficult life, almost as an outlaw. Now Saul was dead; after being wounded in battle, he had taken his own life. In fact, Saul and three of his sons, including David's friend Jonathan, had died in the same battle (1 Samuel 31:1-6). So the door was wide open for David to become king of Israel.

David didn't rejoice when he learned of the deaths. Instead he and all his men mourned and wept the entire day (2 Samuel 1:1-12). David even wrote a song in honor of Saul and Jonathan, which can be found in 2 Samuel 1:19-27. He was truly saddened that their lives had ended as they did.

#### Uniting the Kingdom

David was made king of Judah. Israel followed Abner, the commander of Saul's army, who made Ish-Bosheth, a son of Saul, king over Israel (2 Samuel 2:1-9). After years of much fighting, intrigue, and bloodshed, Ish-Bosheth was murdered, and the leaders of Israel came to David to make him king over them.

## **David Leads Israel**

David was 37 when he became king over all Israel. He had first been anointed to succeed Saul many years earlier, while still in his teens. After his long, patient wait, David was able to lead Israel to great prosperity, fend off the Philistines, and expand the boundaries

of Israel during his reign. David wasn't perfect, but as he relied on God, God rewarded him and Israel with prosperity.

David wrote Psalm 37, which describes his trust in God even when he was surrounded by enemies. In this psalm, David says to "delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart" (Psalm 37:4). This could have been the theme of David's life.

## **The Jesus Connection**

Through Jesus, God showed us how to take every step of life relying on him. Because of Jesus' courage, we can believe that trusting God will always be worth it!

What past experience has God used to teach you how to rely on him?







#### What You'll Do

Sing or listen to these simple songs. During "Jesus Is All the World to Me" (track 2 on the CD), have children clap to the rhythm of the music.

Say: This is David. He's thinking about obeying. David obeyed his parents, and he obeyed God. Use the handle to spin the face around. God made David the king. David obeyed God, and God made him king. You can see the crown on David's head. Point to the crown.

Say: I'm going to turn the puppet. When you see David smiling and wearing his crown, clap your hands. Turn the puppet several times. David was happy because God helped David, and ▶ GOD HELPS US.

Look through magazines, and cut out an outdoor picture.

Ask: Do you see my pretty picture? There are many beautiful things in it. I see [name a few things in the picture]. What do you see?

Allow your child time to look at the picture and point to or tell about things he or she sees.

Say: All of these wonderful things are gifts from God. God helps us and gives good gifts to his children.

Say: God gives us many wonderful things. What do you see in your picture? Tell what you see also.

Say: God helps us and gives us good gifts like all the things in your picture.



# Safe, Secure, and Special

Babies and toddlers develop a sense of security by learning that they are special to parents and caregivers. Reassuring words, hugs, and pats demonstrate that you value your child. Tell your child how special he or she is to you and to God. This helps little ones grow up confident in who they are and whose they are.



#### Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:


- Take a nature walk through your backyard or at a park. Remind your child that God helps us and gives us good things.
